



TECHNIQUE AND ATTITUDE

From December 18th~28th of December 2011, a group of 36 people traveled to Japan to do benefit concerts for the Tohoku Tsunami relief effort. It consisted of Kinnara Taiko, Gagaku, and Bugaku and dance members from the Arpana Dance Company, with their teacher Ramya Harishankar. Arpana is a Bharatanatyam dance troupe, the classical dance form of South India. We put together a program, paid our own way, and did benefit performances at the Hiroshima Betsuin, the Komyoji temple in Kure, visited Kyoto, and had a final performance at a hall sponsored by the Saikoji temple in Nara. The Nara performance had two groups: our group of traditional Japanese and Indian music and dance, and a Japanese Jazz band. The irony did not go unnoticed. The program was well received, the audiences were generous in their donations to the relief fund, the food was fantastic, the temple members were warm and welcoming – a memorable trip.

Not having been back to Japan in a while, it was exciting to be re-reminded of what made me excited about my first encounter with Japan almost a half century ago. It was and is a well-ordered and well-structured society where group consciousness is high and group harmony highly valued. Everyday interactions are profoundly “civil” and everyday “service” is a wonder to behold. While in Hiroshima, I had to go to the post office to pay a bill to a transport company for taiko we had rented in Japan. It was a very

busy place, but a worker patiently listened to my needs in what must have been to him a very strange form of Japanese coming out of my mouth. He helped me with the forms and took me to the window where I paid the fee. It was like walking into a fancy hotel and getting vip treatment. Let us not discuss the U.S. postal service.

“Sa-bisu” or “service” is taken seriously in Japan. It is not just something you offer to bring in more money – it is valued in and of itself. It is not a means to an end, it is the attitude itself that is valued. From buying tsukemono at a small shop to making major purchases at a Buddhist supply house, the attitude is the same – cordial, efficient, and welcoming. Confrontation, adversarial stances, and the like are not highly valued. Even bargaining at the flea market is a kind of pleasant game, as it is in India. The Indian-American girls in the dance troop were right at home bargaining and having fun doing so. Food too is about taste and presentation. The Japanese are picky about food, how it is prepared and how it is presented. I looked for a bad meal and could not find it. Everything from an outdoor grilled oyster stand at Miyajima to a sit down dinner in Kyoto had the same attention given to taste, presentation, and the guest. A 180 from our American idea of a great meal defined by low price and quantity. I lost 2 pounds in 10 days in Japan while eating more often, better food and great company.

I don't know what all this means, but it does have something to do with an attitude difference – a more relaxed, less perfection-orientated attitude that ironically results in highly refined technique, craftsmanship, and interrelations. I cannot help thinking that though largely unconscious for most Japanese, it is still a profoundly Buddhist country. As for those who are consciously aware of Buddhism – they are a sight to behold. Playing for temple audiences was at one in the same time, new and familiar. It was like a familiar reunion with people we had never met. Even the glitches and complete stop in the music dvd was the cause for a unique and wonderful interaction between the Indian dancers and the Fujinkai in the audience..

For all the hand-wringing and concern for the future of temples in Japan, Jodoshinshu is alive and well in the temple sanghas of Japan. And by extension – so are we.

SENSHINJI BUILDING FUND – OGAWA TRUST FUND

This will begin a new series of updates on the continuing “saga” of improvements to the Senshin temple facilities. To clarify the above titling, it should be explained that the Senshin-ji Building Fund has been supplemented with a gift from the estate of the late Kikuo and Kaoru Ogawa. Kaoru “Kay” Ogawa passed away in January 2010, and her death put into motion the transfer of funds from a trust account that was created by Mr. & Mrs. Ogawa prior to the death of Kikuo in 2004.

As they had been in life, the two of them were exceedingly generous to Senshin following their deaths. They left a significant gift to the temple, that we have been advised, was made with the intent that the funds be used for capital improvements, for major repairs or for the acquisition of adjoining properties (if they became available while the funds were still in hand). As such, because the Board of Directors had decided to maintain the Senshin-ji Building Fund for facility improvement purposes, it was decided to deposit the Ogawas’ gift into the existing Building Fund account, which had essentially been depleted during the past six years of construction on the various Senshin-ji projects. For this reason, the titling of future updates will refer to the Ogawa Trust Fund in addition to the Senshin-ji Building Fund so that we may recognize the impact of the Ogawa contribution towards future Senshin facility improvements.

As you may have noticed in the previous issues of the *Prajna*,

the temple continues to receive donations to the Senshin-ji Building Fund, and the Board is deeply grateful for the ongoing expression of *Dana*. As in the past six years, we shall list the names of those who have made these contributions, and we will be sure that such gifts benefit the upcoming improvement projects that are being planned.

For those who have been at Senshin for the past several months, you may have noticed that we had problems with the initial floor installations. After the third try, the floor installation subcontractor and the floor materials subcontractor were able to root out the cause of the problems. The main library/lounge room, the restrooms, electrical room, the small stairwell foyer and Rev. Mas’ study classroom have now finally been completed. We hope to complete the floors for the two ministers’

offices and the main office by the first week of February. Thereafter, we will be replacing the classroom windows on the second floor of the Education Building. That should finalize all the work on that building.

Because a replacement of the Social Hall with a new structure would be cost prohibitive, the Board has decided to refurbish it by upgrading the plumbing, heating, cooling and electrical systems. In addition, we plan to refinish the hardwood floor, update the kitchen and improve the restrooms. We do not know the total cost of the proposed work, but we hope to get an estimate during the coming year, and we hope to begin working on the Social Hall before the end of 2012.
