THE LOVE OF THINGS IS A DISEASE WITH THEM

I cannot remember exactly who said this, but it was a native American leader in his encounter with the new invading European-Americans. It was so then and it seems to be so now. What one owns seems to be of prime importance in life. Success is defined by how much money you can get to buy what is currently considered valuable. Even the basics of food, clothing, and shelter have gone far beyond the definition of basic necessities. "Good" food is in gourmet fads, clothing "makes" the man or woman - or more recently children dressed and trained to act as adults. Shelter has become more than shelter. It has become ostentatious display - ten people living in a hundred rooms while all around, there are ten people living in one room. The outer world of perceptions is considered the only world there is. What's out there is real and how you relate to it is all there is. Life therefore is a constant battle, a constant challenge - and how you encounter it will make you or break you. Such an attitude or philosophy produces what we have - a tiny minority of super-powerful, super-wealthy, super-controlling, super-self-contained and self-absorbed "success stories", and a vast ocean of "failures", struggling to achieve the same status. It is no wonder that we are ill at ease with life, diseased with life..

As societies become wealthier, wealth becomes the goal in life. It is the purpose of living - until of course the approach of death. Friend death somehow makes us more human and less mechanical again. For Buddhists, if everything

is intimately interconnected, there can be no significant reality to separate lives and existences. Separate, unconnected individuals are only provisionally real, functioning delusions at best. And yet it seems impossibly difficult to see the absurdity in the statement "I am me", or, "I gotta be me". Why is there so much suffering in the world? Might it not start from my need to understand the world in my way, from my need to see truth, love, life, and beauty from my point of view and mine alone? Is it not from my need to remove all the mystery and contradictions from my life so that the driver is in full control? There will soon be a car that will drive itself - what a maddening prospect for a control-freak - we will just have to find a new machine besides a gun where we can feel in complete control and all-powerful.

This world of self-centeredness is the world of Samsara, of delusion and suffering. And this fundamental suffering, this disease includes the hellish sufferings of the 19 hells up to and including the *ennui* and aesthetic pains and dissatisfactions of being in the heavens. And it is exactly these six realms of suffering that constitute Nirvana - the harmonious world of effortless and natural enjoyment. The only difference between the two worlds is in how we understand them. Samsara is from the standpoint of "I", "Me", "My", while Nirvana is from the standpoint of "all". Shinran Shonin's presentation is one of "self-power and other power", of ego-power and reality power; the former separating and defending, the latter unifying and including.

Amida Buddha is the name of that other-power presence in us - and when this is noticed, all's right with the world. There is no agenda, only the smooth functioning of relationships. Samsara is Namo, and Nirvana is Amidabutsu, and this living paradox is reality. It is not going from Samsara to Nirvana, from Namo to Amidabutsu. It is rather being made to see the awesome and awful chasm between the two and, at the same time, the essential oneness of the two. Namo, the eternal control-freak that I am, and Amidabutsu the ever-supportive, ever-flowing reality upon which I float. And when this happens, the only thing left to be done is enjoy. Such moments are fleeting, but without them, how much less of a human being we are. Such a moment of connectedness is called Compassion. It is not a cultivated quality, it is the nature and beauty of reality itself. It is Namoamidabutsu suddenly saying you instead of you saying Namoamidabutsu. How do we experience this? In Jodoshinshu, by being attentive to how our beloved egos struggle to separate Namo from Amidabutsu, believing that this is how we 'get it', not understanding that we are already "got". Amida loves me; Shikataganai, Mottainai, Arigatai - Reality and Beauty already has a hold of me, It can't be helped, all this wasted on me, Wow thank you.

SENSHINJI BUILDING FUND – OGAWA TRUST FUND

First of all, a correction of fact from last month's article. Mrs. Kaoru "Kay" Ogawa passed away in January 2011, not January 2010 as stated last month. I offer my apologies for this error.

The floors for the two ministers' offices (one of which is currently occupied by the Hongwanji Place bookstore) and the main office have been resurfaced and match the flooring of the other rooms on the first level of the Education Building. By the time that you read this, we hope to have moved all furnishings and furniture back into those rooms. Reverend Mas and Janice have had to put up with a lot of disruption during the 10-day period that was required to complete the work, and we thank them for their patience. We shall next focus on replacing the classroom windows on the second floor of the Education Building as they are in rather bad condition.

We are also taking a look at the front doors to the *Hondo* building as they appear to be having problems with opening and closing properly. We also will try to follow up on the replacement of the two outside doors on the south side of the *Hondo* building, as they are in poor condition and not very stable.

With regard to the Social Hall, the temple's Board of Directors has agreed to refurbish it by upgrading the plumbing, heating, cooling and electrical systems. In addition, we wish to refinish the hardwood floor, update the kitchen and improve the

restrooms. We shall be holding a series of meetings with the BWA, the ABA and other groups/individuals in order to arrive at a consensus of opinion about how to remodel the kitchen so that we will have one that can effectively serve the temple's members for years to come.

This planning process will take some time since we will have to sort through the needs and wants of the various organizations, but we hope to get a plan together and then obtain an estimate during the coming year; we would like to begin working on the Social Hall by the end of 2012, if at all possible.

In the interim, any and all contributions to the Building Fund will be earmarked towards these future improvements.
