We like to sing Seiya at the Sunday service. Although, we have many other Buddhist gatha to choose from and the lyrics are in Japanese, somehow, the chairpersons often selects *Seiya* for us to sing. And no one complains. Probably, one reason we like Seiya is the soaring but grounded melody. Overall, the melody sounds bright, but it is not too

bright. It sounds melancholy too. Such a melody matches the Buddhist expression of the Truth where two opposites co-reside together. As Buddhists, we like this kind of melody.

The lyrics were originally a poem composed by Lady Takeko Kujo (1887-1928), who was the sister of the 22nd Monshu (Head

Lady Kujo is known as the co-founder of *Fujinkai* or BWA (Buddhist Women's Association). She and her sister-in-law, Ohtani Kazuko founded the BWA in 1907. As the leaders of BWA, they worked hard to establish the girls' high school and



the women's college in Kyoto to give Buddhist education to the young women. In addition to founding the Fujinkai and the schools for Buddhist women, she founded a hospital. In 1923, the big earthquake hit Tokyo, causing huge damages all over the city. About 1,900,000 people were devastated and 100,000 people died. She helped to rebuild Tsukiji Hongwanji and provided medical treatment to the victims of the earthquake. She played an active part, not only in Jodo Shinshu temples, but also outside of the temples for the public welfare.

Hence, Lady Kujo was a very influential figure in Hongwanji. She was also very popular among Japanese people in those days. She was admired as one of the top beauty celebrities and her lifestyle was featured in Japanese women's magazines. Her collected poems became a best-selling book named *Muyuge* as well as her picture and poster. In 1928,

at the age of 41, six months after publishing her collection of poetry, she passed away due to an illness. It is said that she passed away while reciting the nembutsu. After she died, a movie company made a film of her life and her poetry in honor of her work.

The song, *Seiya*, appears in her book, *Muyuge*. I would like to add the English translation below:

Seiya (peaceful night)

"How beautiful the starry sky! Who could know the mystery of the heavens?

When these countless eyes shine brilliantly,

My heart is filled with joy!

More numerous than the sands of the Ganges are the Buddhas. When I heard that they watch over us night and day,

My heart is filled with peace."

In this poem, Lady Kujo compares the stars to the Buddhas as the numerous numbers of stars in the sky and the numerous numbers of Buddhas watching over us. Sometimes stars are related to the deceased. A Greek philosopher of the 1st B.C.E. seriously mentioned that the deceased becomes a star.

Traditionally, in Jodo Shinshu, the deceased are respected as Buddhas, protecting us and guiding us to be born in the Pure Land. Shinran Shonin composed a Wasan (hymn):

"When we say *Namu-amida-butsu*, The countless Buddhas throughout the ten quarters,

Surrounding us a hundredfold, a thousandfold,

Rejoice in and protect us."

As the poem relates, we can think that Lady Takeko Kujo, together with masters of Pure Land teaching, our ancestors, family members, and the temple pioneers have become one of the shiny eyes in the night sky or one of the Buddhas who protects us all the time.

この詞は九条武子さまが書かれたものです。九条武子さま(1887-1928)は第22代ご門主の大谷光瑞猊下の妹さんです。 九条家にとつがれたので名字が九条になっておられます。その九条家から、大谷光瑞門主とご結婚されて本願寺のお裏方になられたのが、籌子(かずこ)さまです。

籌子さまと武子さまは仏教婦人会の創立者として知られています。1907年に婦人会を組織した後、若い世代に仏教精神に基づいた教育を施すため、現在の京都女子高校と京都女子大学を創立しました。

1911年に籌子さまがお亡くなりになった後、武子さまは仏教婦人会の会長に就任。1928年に起こった関東大震災で倒壊した築地本願寺の復興、被災した方々のための救

援活動、病院の設立など、本願寺内外でたいへんご活躍されました。

1927年に「無憂華」という詩とエッセイ集が出版され、ベストセラーとなりましたが、その翌年、震災の復興事業などで無理をされ、42歳の若さで往生されました。その後、武子さまの人生を描いた映画が製作され、武子さまの死を悼んで、日本中の人々が映画館におしよせたそうです。

### **Senshin-ji Building Fund** November 2016 Update

As this article is being written, it has been exactly two months since the remodeling of the Social Hall began on August 8. There has been significant progress, but unfortunately, a few more unexpected issues have arisen beyond those described in last month's article. Most of these issues

As such, we have to comply with their directions, most of which involve various building codes and laws.

The interior of the building underwent a significant amount of gutting in order to prepare it for new electrical and plumbing installations, as well as to repair and replace some severe termite- and water-damaged wood. Environmental inspectors determined that the planned height of the parapets (vertical wall extensions) was too short, so the contractors were ordered to make them taller in order to completely screen the roof-mounted HVAC equipment from the view of pedestrians walking along adjacent sidewalks and streets. This change required a revision of the construction plans in order to fully comply. When

this work is completed, it will give the illusion that the Social Hall is two stories tall!

The LADWP required that we install a larger electrical cabinet, which would have to be ground-mounted on a new concrete pad instead of being wall-mounted as originally designed. An even heavier impact resulted from the LADWP's requirement that all electrical service cables from their power poles had to be buried rather than strung from their overhead wires to the cabinet location. Due to the size of the cables and the conduit that protects the cables, a 7-foot deep trench, 3 feet wide, had to be dug with heavy machinery across the width of the parking lot. This work alone added a significant amount of cost to the overall project, but we had no choice. Without this buried cable, the LADWP would not approve electrical service to be turned on for the remodeled Social Hall.

At this point, we seem to have jumped the most important and significant hurdles, and we are hoping that the remainder of the construction work and installations will proceed with no further delays and with no further cost increases. We should have a much better assessment of this in next month's article.

Quite a few temple members have had input into various aspects of the



remodeling work, including selection of wall and floor tiling in the restrooms, linoleum vinyl tiling in the kitchen and hallways, selection of continued on page 8

continued from page 7 oven and range, and the layout/design of the kitchen millwork (cabinetry). It is especially important to offer our deep thanks to Russell Nishida and his business (Basically Cabinets, Inc.) for

taking on the critical task of designing the kitchen. Russell has spent many hours working on this over the past couple of months, and he has coordinated meetings attended by various temple members who volunteered to

give input to the design. He will be taking all of the comments and suggestions into account to produce a final kitchen layout.

There are sure to be some additional revisions required by the inspectors, but we hope that they will not be too involved or too costly. To be truthful, some of the added requirements have been mind-numbing, but inescapable. We will have to deal with it.

Again, thank you all for hanging in there with us while this project works towards completion.

# Senshin Vehicle Donation
