

Rev. Koyo Tamanaha

How many of you remember Rev. Tamanaha? If you remember him, you are an old-timer. Tamanaha-sensei was our minister from 1952 to 1954. Together with Rev. Kuwatsuki, he was the first Senshin minister since our independence. This year is his 33rd cycle memorial service year. He passed away on April 18, 1985. It was the year Ronald Reagan was president of the United States, and the film, Back to the Future, was released. Kids all over the world played the Nintendo video game, Super Mario Brothers, for the first time. Rev. Tamanaha was born in Okinawa on December 20, 1898. United States was fighting Spain and Hawaii was adopted as a



territory of the United States.

According to a BCA history book, Rev. Tamanaha graduated from Okinawa Teacher's College in 1917, and a few years later, he became a police officer. Rev. Tets Unno remembered Rev. Tamanaha, "He was *maru maru* (round and plump), center

of his gravity lowered to the ground. He was 5th degree Judo." Mas-sensei also said, "He looked very strong, it makes sense he was a police officer in Japan." After having 9 years of experience as a police officer in Okinawa, he obtained a Bachelor's Degree from Nihon University in Tokyo in 1930. He later studied Jodo Shinshu Buddhism at Chuo Bukkyo Gakuin in Kyoto. Not many people remember him now so we are not sure why he went into the ministry. He belonged to Daitenji in Naha, Okinawa, near Kokusai dori.

Anyway, he became a minister in 1933. In 1937, he arrived in the states with his wife, Yukiko, as a Kaikyoshi (overseas minister). He was assigned to Brawley Temple, then transferred to Bakersfield Temple in 1939. In 1941, he moved to Salinas Temple. While he was in Salinas, the war broke out between the U.S. and Japan. Since he was a religious leader, he was sent to camps in Lordsburgh and Santa Fe in New Mexico. Later, he was sent to Tule Lake Camp. After the war, he was released and assigned to Los Angeles Betsuin. In 1952, he became a first minister of our Senshin Buddhist Temple (in those days, Senshin Buddhist Church was the official name). For two years, he engaged in the propagation of Jodo Shinshu teaching to the people in the Seinan area (Southwest LA), and in 1954, he retired.

According to Mas-sensei, who came to Senshin in 1968, he often saw him since he was living down the street from Senshin. "He was sitting on his front porch and watching the people walking down the street. He would sometimes come to attend the services." Tets-sensei, who was our minister from 1962 to 1966. also said, "I saw him at the services and Howakai (Dharma gathering) at

built our temple and maintained it as an important religious center, we can still gather at the temple to enjoy listening to the teaching. On this occasion, the 33rd cycle memorial year of Rev. Tamanaha, we shall remember him and thank him.

someone's home. He was a devoted Nembutsu follower, so he was a good friend of Kuwatsuki-sensei." An old timer said, "I remember him, but he spoke Japanese, so I don't know if I ever talked to him." There is no record of Tamahana-sensei's message, so we do not know what kind of Dharma messages he gave at the temple, but I believe that many Senshin pioneers enjoyed listening to the teaching and were spiritually nurtured by him. 玉那覇晃洋先生 古本竜太

玉那覇晃洋(たまはなこうよう)先生を知っておられますか?玉那 覇先生は桑月先生とともに、洗心が独立して初代の開教使でした。 1952年から洗心におられ、54年に引退されました。玉那覇先 生は32年前の1985年4月18日に往生されましたので、今年 が33回忌の年にあたります。

1985年といえば、大統領は ロナルド・レーガン、映画、バッ クトゥザフューチャーが公開、任 天堂のスーパーマリオブラザーズ が大人気になった年でした。32 年の月日はだいぶ前のような気が いたしますね。玉那覇先生が開教 使として洗心におられたのは、1 985年より35年前のことです から、もうあまり玉那覇先生を覚 えておられる方がおられません。

洗心がロサンゼルス別院から独 立したころは、今80代の方がテ ィーンエイジャーか20代、今6 0代の方が赤ん坊くらいです。あ る二世のメンバーは、「玉那覇先 生は覚えてるけど、先生は日本語 だけ話されてたし、私も若かった ので、先生と話した記憶がないで す。」と言われます。

海野テッツ先生は「私が196 2年に洗心に来た時、先生は法要 や法話会にお参りされてました。 先生は丸々していて、腕も太かっ たです。柔道五段と言われてまし た。」と先生をはっきりと覚えて おられる方の一人です。

マス先生は1968年に洗心に 来られましたが、玉那覇先生とよ く話していたといわれます。とい うのは、玉那覇先生は引退された 後、洗心のすぐ近くに住まれてい たからです。「玉那覇先生は強そ うな人でした。日本で警察官をさ れていたのは納得です。」と言わ れます。

玉那覇先生は1898年、沖 縄で生まれました。BCAのヒス トリーブックによると、先生は1 917年に沖縄師範大学を卒業、 数年後、警察官となり、9年間勤 められます。警官の職を辞して、 1930年に日本大学で学位をと られました。それから中央仏教学 院で浄土真宗を学ばれて、僧侶の 道へ進まれました。米国にはユキ コ夫人とともに、1937年に開 教使としてこられ、ブローリー仏 教会へ赴任。1939年からベー カーズフィールド仏教会、194 1年にはサリナス仏教会に勤めら れました。サリナス仏教会の開教 使の時に、日米の間で戦争が起こ り、先生は主に日系人社会の指導 者が収容された、ニューメキシコ 州のローズバーグ収容所、サンタ フェ収容所に送られました。サン タフェからツールレイク収容所へ 移り、戦後はロサンゼルス別院の 開教使として赴任され、1952 年に桑月先生とともに、洗心の初 代開教使となられました。

テッツ先生は「玉那覇先生は引 退後も法要や法話会にお参りされ てました。篤信な方で、お念仏を 喜ばれている姿を覚えています。 」今ではあまり先生のことを覚え ている方が少なくなりましたが、 玉那覇先生のご指導や念仏をとな える姿によって、洗心のパイオニ アたちが念仏の教えを深く理解す ることができ、それを受け継ぐ私 たちにも影響を及ぼしていること は間違いありません。先生に直接 会ってなくても、洗心のサンガメ

ンバーを通して、先生から念仏の 教えをいただいているのです。玉 那覇先生の33回忌のご縁に、先 生に感謝し、お寺のおかげで念仏 とともにある人生を歩ませていた だいていることに喜びましょう。

Senshin Vehicle Donation

This is a reminder that Senshin will take any vehicle (car, pickup, truck, motorcycle, and even boat) as a donation to the temple. The funds realized from these donations are earmarked for the Senshin-ji Building Fund. Donors can report the full amount of funds received from the vehicle donation as a deduction on their tax returns.

We work with Harold's Car Donation Service (HCDS) to have the vehicles picked up, processed and refurbished as necessary to bring in the highest sale amount for the donated vehicle. Even if the vehicle is not operational, it can still have salvageable value, sometimes for more than we could expect.

Once the proceeds from the vehicle donation are received by Senshin, a letter is sent to the donor to acknowledge the vehicle donation. The letter includes details of the donated vehicle and the amount for which the vehicle was sold



or salvaged. All donors will be acknowledged in the *Prajna*.

Senshin-ji Building Fund March 2017 Update

The stage lift inspection was signed off on February 16th and the final building inspection was scheduled for the following day. When the final inspector arrived, he accepted the stage lift sign off and then asked if the Green Code approvals were received. The construction supervisor had no idea what the inspector was talking about since there had been no previous reference to a Green Code. However, without the approval for that regulation, the final inspector would not sign off our project and issue a Certificate of Occupancy (C of O).

The Satoh Brothers project manager learned that a full set of documents had to be assembled that certified a number of Green Code requirements, including low-level Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) and low-level formaldehyde used in the manufacture of the cabinets, flooring and paint. We also had to demonstrate that the toilets and water fixtures did not exceed the permissible levels of water usage, and that we had complied with the Title 24 white roof requirements, among other requirements. When the required documents were finally assembled and reviewed on February 24th, the final inspector signed off on the project and told us that we would receive our C of O within 10 days.

We thought "FINALLY!" However, the inspector called later that day to

inform us that we had an open permit that would delay our C of O. Satoh Brothers could not figure out what permit could possibly be open since all the various trade permits had been signed off individually. On February 27th, it was determined that the open permit was from 2007, and that it pertained to the Nokotsudo. That was a whole different project from 10 years ago, and therefore had no bearing on the Social Hall approval. We will deal with the 2007 open permit separately.

So, after innumerable delays and inspection snafus during the past two months, the Social Hall is now officially approved for occupancy. The kitchen cabinetry work is undergoing some final tweaks, and the last of the finish work and cleaning were underway, but we began moving some things back into the Social Hall storage rooms. We hope to have the building up and running in full mode by mid-March.

It has been a long haul, but your support and patience has been deeply appreciated. Furumoto-sensei is planning to hold a celebration activity on the same day as our Ohigan service on March 19th. If you have time, come by and check out the remodeled Social Hall.

I grew up around Senshin. I was a willful, impatient and stubborn child who would get bored during the sermon, and chant at the times when only Rev. Mas was supposed to (my Grandma Sachi would tell me I wasn't supposed do this, but I told her I didn't care, I wanted to, and eventually she gave up). I once remember chasing my brother and his friends around the temple after Dharma School. I went into the Hondo, walked up to the podium and repeatedly yelled at them, "If you don't come back right now, YOU'RE ALL GONNA DIE!" It wasn't until Johnny Mori came and told us to get out that I realized my words were broadcasted to the other buildings, and anyone in the restrooms and the office could hear me.

My point is, I have a lot of memories associated with Senshin, and as I got older I grew to appreciate the service and the events we would go to. But even then, I drifted away from the temple and spent more weekends hanging out with friends and enjoying my young adult life. I would only go to Senshin for the holidays: New Year's, the Matsuri and Obon.

After graduating university, I went to Japan to teach English through the JET Program. I was placed in Takeo City, Saga Prefecture in Kyushu. Takeo City is a 20-minute drive from the rural ceramics town of Arita, the home to AritaYaki. A JET who worked with the city would host an Arita tour once or twice a year, and I would go any chance I could get. We learned about the kilns, the town and the people. It would always end with a Kyoto-style lunch and a chance to paint or throw our own pieces.

I returned to LA in 2014 and moved to Westside in 2015. It was around this time I ran into Wilbur at one of the holiday services and he said, "You're a westside girl now. Hey, that means you can come back to Senshin!"

While I agreed with him, I wasn't entirely sure how to "come back" to Senshin. This may not make much sense, but by this time I had spent a good 10-15 years away, and I wasn't entirely sure how would I get back into the swing of things since I am now an adult and not a very energetic child. There was always an excuse not to go--I worked hard that week and wanted to sleep in, I needed to play with the cat, I needed to do laundry, etc.

It was another one of the holiday services that Bob announced WasabiKai. It took a few emails and about a year, but I am now in the dinnerware class. It has been incredibly fun not only creating my own ware, but to return to the classrooms I used to yell

at my brother to "Shut up!" in. Bob was adamant that I could never miss a class. It was scheduling conflicts that didn't allow me to take the class sooner. But I now have a reason to come back every week for the next month. When the class ends, I plan and hope to continue the habit of coming back. Attending WasabiKai has allowed me to reconnect with Senshin. The people are not all the same and the reverends have changed, but it still has the same kind, enduring spirit as when I left.


Senshin Karate Club
