

Ojizo-san is a popular *mingei* (folk art) doll. Similar to Daruma-san, Ojizo-san is a Buddhist

icon. Ojizo-san is a nickname for Jizo Bosatsu (Bodhisattva).

You will see statues of
Jizo Bosatsu all over Japan
in the temples, cemeteries
and small wayside shrines in vil-

and small wayside shrines in villages as well as along the roadside of suburban areas.

Jizo is respected as a symbolic Bodhisattva. Symbolical Bodhisattvas are not historical figures.



They symbolize the workings of Buddha's wisdom and compassion in stories, sutras and Buddhist art, such as paintings and statues.

A Bodhisattva is "one who seeks Bodhi (enlightenment)" and his ideal is the "happiness of others as the first priority," which is very different from "America first," or "me first."

You may think there is no such person who can think and practice "others first." You are right. That's why Bodhisattvas are symbolical. Most everyone has a wish for another's happiness, but in most cases, we notice that such a wish is too dreamy or unlikely. For instance, we cannot give our home to a homeless person or we do not want to give our position to our colleagues, teammates, classmates, for their happiness. We cannot help putting our happiness first. But we know that such a dream for "others' happiness" is important. When such a dream is symbolized in Buddhist context, it appears as symbolical Bodhisattvas. One of them is Ojizo-san.

Ojizo-san symbolizes the compassionate working of Buddha, especially helping children. There are many folk tales that relate to Ojizo-san, but a famous one is giving help to children in hell. Jizo Bodhisattva protects the children in hell. They are tortured by ogres but Jizo appears and guards and guides them to be born to a better state. In the olden days when the death rate of children was very high, many parents were saved by hearing Jizo Bodhisattva's compassionate deed for their deceased children. Therefore, Ojizo-san has been respected as a guardian for children and is still enshrined in a wayside shrine between modern buildings in cities in Japan.

Although Jizo Bodhisattva is popular, in Jodo Shinshu, we only entrust ourselves to Amida Buddha.

sion when we attain enlightenment. "Me first" is our way of thinking, but by hearing "others first" as Jizo



Therefore, Jodo Shinshu temples do not enshrine Jizo Bodhisattva statues. Because a Bodhisattva shows the working of the Buddha's compassion, we can think Jizo Bodhisattva's compassion is included in Amida's compassion. Shinran Shonin wrote in a hymn, "When a person realizes the mind of nondiscrimination, that attainment is the 'state of regarding each being as one's only child....' (CWS p.350)" He mentioned that Buddha's compassion is likened to the parents' love of their children. Then we ourselves can have this compasBodhisattva and Amida Buddha's way of thinking, we can reflect on our ego and encourage ourselves to think of others' happiness.

お地蔵さん

先月に引き続きまして、お寺のオフィスに展示されている民芸品 についてのお話です。だるまさんの人形は日本でとても親しまれ ていますが、お地蔵さんの人形もさまざまな場所でみかけます。 お地蔵さんの場合は、民芸品の人形よりも、日本各地の寺院、お 墓、街中にある祠、山や田舎の道沿いなどで信仰の対象として安

置されているものが多いです。

お地蔵さんは、地蔵菩薩とい う菩薩さまです。菩薩とは、仏に なることを目指して修行されてい る仏道修行者です。地蔵菩薩をは じめ、観音菩薩、勢至菩薩などが 有名ですが、そういった菩薩は 歴史的に実在された方ではなく、 象徴的な存在として敬われていま す。象徴とは、なにかを表現する ためのものですが、象徴的な菩薩 は仏のはたらき、智慧や慈悲など を表しています。それは、経典の お話や民話、また絵画や像などを 通じて知ることができます。

菩薩のモットーは「上求菩提下 化衆生(じょうぐぼだいげけしゅ じょう)」と言われます。

簡単にいえば、「他の幸せが自 分の幸せ」ということです。自分 の利益と他への利益が完全に一致 しているのが特徴です。自分が仏 となることは、自分は無であり、 またそれは自分が他から成り立っ ているとわかることです。それが わかると、自他の区別、差別が見 事に解消されるので、他人の幸せ が自分の幸せとなるのです。基本 的にわれわれ大乗仏教徒は、この 菩薩のモットーにのっとって生活 するべきなのですが、自分の生活 をみつめると、菩薩のモットーと は反対の考え方、常に自分の幸せ を第一に考えていること、に気づ かされます。たとえば、ホームレ スの人に自分の家をあげたという 人は聞いたことがありませんし、 自分の会社や学校、スポーツチー ムでのポジションを他人の幸せの ためにゆずるというのは、大変難 しいことです。また、たとえ自分 とホームレスの人がハッピーとな っても、家を失った家族は非常に

アンハッピーです。このように、 われには不可能に近く、菩薩のモの生活を反省するのです。 ットーからは遠い存在です。けれ ども、そういうモットーは常に求 められるべきものであるので、象

自利と利他が円満することはわれ て、菩薩の精神を敬い、自己中心

地蔵菩薩さまは、仏の慈悲を表 しています。特に子供たちを守り 育む精神を表しています。日本に はお地蔵さんにまつわる民話が多 くありますが、有名なのは、地獄 の賽の河原で鬼にいじめられてい る子供たちを救うお話です。地獄 に行った子供たちは河原で石を積 まないといけないのですが、鬼が 来てその石をくずしたり、金棒で 子供たちを打つのです。それを地 蔵菩薩が助け、地獄から抜け出す 道を教えてあげるといいます。

このお話しは、子供たちの死亡 率が高かった昔は、とてもポピュ ラーになり、日本のあちらこちら にお地蔵さんの石像がたてられ、 亡くなった子供を弔うようになっ たと考えられています。

お地蔵さんは人気のある菩薩様 なのですが、浄土真宗では阿弥陀 仏だけにおまかせすることを基本 とした教えなので、お寺にお地蔵 さんの像や絵像を安置しません。 けれども、菩薩は仏の慈悲を表現 していることを考えると、お地蔵 さまの慈悲は阿弥陀さまの慈悲の 表れだといえます。親鸞聖人は和 讃で、仏の心は、衆生ひとりひと りをあたかも自分の子供だとして ケアしていく心だと言われており ます。そういう仏、菩薩の心と我 々の自分の幸せが第一とする心を くらべて、恥ずかしく思わせてい ただき、できるだけ他のことも考 えよう、という思いが起こるの が、浄土真宗の教えを聞く者が得 る利益です。




Monthly Memorial Service JUNE

Senshin Vehicle Donation

This is a reminder that Senshin will take any vehicle (car, pickup, truck, motorcycle, and even boat) as a donation to the temple. The funds realized from these donations are earmarked for the Senshin-ji Building Fund. Donors can report the full amount of funds received from the vehicle donation as a deduction on their tax returns.

We work with Harold's Car Donation Service (HCDS) to have the vehicles picked up, processed and refurbished as necessary to bring in the highest sale amount for the donated vehicle. Even if the vehicle is not operational, it can still have salvageable value, sometimes for more than we could expect.

Once the proceeds from the vehicle donation are received by Senshin, a letter is sent to the donor to acknowledge the vehicle donation. The letter includes details of the donated vehicle and the amount



for which the vehicle was sold or salvaged. All donors will be acknowledged in the *Prajna*.

The Kikuo and Kaoru Ogawa **2017 Memorial Scholarship**

- 5. Must be the member of a Buddhist Temple/Sangha.
