

## R E S P E C T

A few months ago, the *Rolling Stone* Magazine updated their “500 Greatest Songs of All Times” for the first time in 17 years. The first one was issued in 2004 and most of the top 40 songs were the *Sansei* and Baby Boomer generation’s favorite songs, the 50’s, 60’s and 70’s songs like the Beatles, Marvin Gaye, Elvis, Bob Marley, etc. Bob Dylan’s “*Like a Rolling Stone*” is listed as the



## No.1 Greatest Song.

The updated list is open to the younger generation. Many songs of the 80's, 90's and the 21st century are ranked in the top 40, and some of the older generation do not agree with this updated list. But, because they chose Aretha Franklin's "*Respect*" as

the No.1 Greatest Song, the older generation can still accept this updated list.

"*Respect*" was originally released as Otis Redding's song in 1965, and the lyrics were asking for respect from man to woman. Aretha Franklin liked this song and she covered it in 1967. She changed several parts of the lyrics, asking "R-E-S-P-E-C-T..." from woman to man. This song became a smash hit. It ranked in the No.1 *Billboard* Chart and she won the Grammy award that year. She said she was just singing about woman and man relationships; but, due to the times, some people prefer to take this song as an anthem of the women's rights movement. She was proud of this feminist interpretation and when she was interviewed by *Elle* Magazine in 2016, said, "We have the power. We are very resourceful. Women absolutely deserve respect. I think women and children and older people are the three least-respected groups in our society."

One of the Jodo Shinshu Buddhist practices in our daily lives is respect. We try to respect everyone. Children, elder people, women, men, LGBTQ, poor people, rich people, those who we like and those whom we do not like. We try to respect everyone.

According to the English dictionary,

one definition of respect is, "to feel or show admiration for someone or something that you believe has good ideas or qualities."

Each person has different character and qualities, and usually, we respect people who have better qualities than us.

But if there are people whom we think are not better than us, do we respect them? Usually, we may not.

But Jodo Shinshu Buddhists practice to respect all others, and we do not see their quality or character to respect. We see Amida Buddha's working in their hearts and minds and we respect them as they have the potential to attain Nirvana.

Shinran Shonin stated in "*Notes on Essentials of Faith Alone*"

"This Tathagata pervades the countless worlds, it fills the hearts and minds of the ocean of all beings. Thus, plants, trees, and land all attain Buddhahood." (CWS, p.461)

Tathagata means Buddha and Shinran Shonin meant that Amida Buddha's power reaches into all beings' and non beings' hearts and minds.

Shinran Shonin thought that Amida Buddha's working in the hearts and minds can take the form of *Shinjin* that enables us to be born in the Pure Land and to become the Buddha. Therefore,

he also called *Shinjin* in our hearts and minds as Buddha Nature, potential to become a Buddha. Whether people are Buddhist or not, good or bad, young or old, men or women, rich or poor, everyone equally has the potential to become a Buddha and every one is respected.


"*Bodhisattva of Never Despise*" appears in the *Lotus Sutra*. This Bodhisattva's practice is to always respect and *gassho* to all others. Some people threw stones at him, but he bowed to them. His thought is "All others are future Buddha, so all are respected."

Some Jodo Shinshu followers see others as Bodhisattvas who encourage them to see their self-centeredness. Therefore, they respect people whom they don't like. They think that we should be especially respectful and grateful to people who make us angry. They tell us "things do not go as you wish. That is life."

What everyone needs is respect. Let's try to respect others as our daily Buddhist practice.

## リスペクト

数ヶ月前、Rolling Stone誌が17年ぶりに「500 Greatest Songs of All Times」を更新しました。前回の2004年のリストでは、上位40曲のほとんどは三世や団塊の世代に馴染みのある曲で、ビートルズ、マービン・ゲイ、エルヴィス、ボブ・マーリーなどの50年代、

60年代、70年代の曲が並んでいました。その時の1位はボブ・ディランの「ライク・ア・ローリング・ストーン」でした。

新たに発表されたリストには、若い世代の曲が選ばれていました。80年代、90年代、そして21世紀の曲がトップ40に多くランクインしており、年配の方の中にはこの新しいリストに納得がいてない人もいます。けれども、アレサ・フランクリンの「リスペクト」が1位に選ばれているので、多くの年配の方々はこの少し若者向けにアレンジされたリストを受け入れています。

"Respect"は、もともと1965年にオーティス・レディングの曲として発表されたもので、歌詞の内容は、男性から女性に敬意を求めるものでした。この曲を気に入ったアレサ・フランクリンは、1967年にこの曲をカバーしました。彼女は歌詞のいくつかの部分を変えて、女性から男性へ敬意を求めたのです。この曲は大ヒットし、ビルボード・チャートの1位を獲得。その年のグラミー賞まで受賞したのです。彼女は、この曲はただ単に女性と男性の関係を歌っただけだと言っていました。1960年代後半の、女性の権利運動が盛り上がる中で、ムーブメントを牽引するテーマ曲だと受けとめられるようになりました。彼女は、このフェミニズム的な解釈を誇りに思っており、2016年に『エル』誌のインタビューを受けた際には、「私たち女性には力があります。なんでもこなすことができるのです。」

女性はもっと尊敬されるべきなのです。私たちの社会で最も尊敬されていないグループは、女性と子どもとお年寄りだと思います。」と言っています。

浄土真宗の念仏者が日々実践しようとしてくることのひとつに「敬意」があります。子ども、お年寄り、女性、男性、LGBTQ、貧しい人、金持ちの人、自分の好きな人、嫌いな人。すべての人を尊敬の眼差しを持って接するのです。

英語の辞書によると、尊敬の定義のひとつは、「良い考えや資質を持っている人やものに対して、感心を感じたり、示したりすること」とあります。

人にはそれぞれ違った性格や資質がありますが、通常、私たちは自分よりも優れた資質を持つ人を尊敬します。

しかし、他人を見て、自分よりも優れていない人だと思ったら、その人を尊敬するのでしょうか？ 恐らく、尊敬しないでしょう。むしろ見下すかもしれません。

浄土真宗の仏教徒は、相手の資質や性格を見て尊敬するかどうか決めるではありません。ひとりびとりの心に阿弥陀仏がはたらいておられるのを感じ、すべての人が涅槃に到達する可能性を持っていることを尊重するのです。

親鸞聖人は「唯信鈔文意」の中で次のように述べています。

「この如来、微塵世界にみちみちたまへり、すなはち一切群生海の心にみちたまへるなり。草木国土ごとく、みな成仏すると説けり」

親鸞聖人は、阿弥陀仏の力がすべての生物や非生物の心に届いており、成仏させようとはたらいてくださっていると云われるのです。

そして親鸞聖人は、阿弥陀仏の

力が心の中ではたらくと、お浄土に生まれて仏になるための「信心」という形になるとも言われます。それで親鸞聖人は、私たちの心の中にある信心を、「仏性」仏になる可能性だとも呼ばれています。仏教徒であろうとなかろうと、善人であろうと悪人であろうと、老いも若きも、男性も女性も別の性も、金持ちであろうと貧乏であろうと、誰にも阿弥陀仏の力が届いており、等しく仏になる可能性を持っているので、誰もが尊重されるべきだといことになるのです。

法華経に"常不軽菩薩"という菩薩が登場します。この菩薩の修行は、すべての人に常に敬意を払い、合掌することです。この菩薩を嫌い、石を投げる人もいましたが、"他のすべての人は未来の仏であるから、すべての人を尊敬する"という心情で、敵にさへも合掌し、敬意を表すのです。

浄土真宗の信者の中には、他人を菩薩だと尊敬する方もいます。中には、自分を怒らせた人に対して、特に感謝する方もいます。自分が怒るときは思い通りにならないときです。思い通りに物事を進めてやるというのは自己中心の恥ずかしい思いなのです。そして自分を怒らす人に「それを気づかせてくれてありがたい」と感謝するのです。

全ての人を尊敬するのは難しいことではありますが、日々の仏道の実践として人を敬うことを心がけましょう。

- 2. You can write a check out to MESP (Michigan Education Savings Program) and mail it directly to PO Box 55925, Boston, MA 02205-5925. Be sure to send a note indicating the contribution is to go to the Senshin Buddhist Temple, Account #9393725.

If you write a check to Senshin, there is no minimum. If you write a check to MESP, the check must be \$25 or more.
