# HANA MATSURI Shakyamuni Buddha and Amida Buddha

This year, our *Hanamatsuri* (Flower Festival) Service will take place on Sunday, April
2. On the following Sunday, April 9, we will join the Butsuren (Los Angeles Buddhist
Temple Federation) *Hanamatsuri* service at

Nishi Betsuin in person or online. *Hanamatsuri* is the celebration of the birth of the founder of Buddhism, Shakyamuni Buddha or Gautama Buddha. Shakyamuni Buddha lived about 2,500 years ago in India. In the Mahayana Buddhism (Northern Buddhism) tradition, Shakyamuni Buddha's birth date is thought to be the eighth day of the fourth month of the Lunar Calendar.

### In Japan, Shakyamuni Buddha's birthday is celebrated on April 8th of the Western calendar.

Shakyamuni means the sage of Shakya and Buddha means the one who awakened to the truth of the universe. He was born as a prince of the "Shakya" clan in India and named Gautama

Siddhartha. Gautama is the family name which means "excellent cow" and Siddhartha means "He who achieves his aim." His father's name was King Suddhodana and his mother's name was Queen Maya. The name of their kingdom was called Kapilavastu which was located near the border of the north part of India and Nepal. When Queen Maya got pregnant, according to the tradition of that time, she was returning to her home country to give birth. On the way to her home, she gave birth to her baby. The place where the baby Shakyamuni Buddha was born was Lumbini in present time Nepal.

It is said that Lumbini's garden was full of blooming flowers; therefore, we call Shakyamuni Buddha's birthday celebration Flower Festival (Hana *Matsuri*) and we decorate the baby Buddha's statue with flowers. Also, according to the legend, when Shakyamuni Buddha was born, he took seven steps and pointed to the sky and the ground, saying "above the earth and below the heaven, I am the most honored one." The seven steps symbolize his emancipation from the six delusional states of the world and the heart and mind (Heaven, Human, Fighting Spirit, Animal, Hungry Ghost, Hell) and attained enlightenment. The deities and gods celebrated his birth and they let sweet rain fall as a blessing. This is the reason we pour sweet tea on the statue of the baby Buddha pointing upward and downward with his fingers.

In Asia, the white elephant is a symbol of auspiciousness, sacred and precious. According to Shakyamuni Buddha's birth story, when his mother,

Oueen Maya, got pregnant, she dreamt of a white elephant entering her body. This is the reason we place a statue of a white elephant in front of the *Onaijin* at Hanamatsuri.



#### JAPANESE DHARMA MESSAGE: APRIL 2023

### 花まつり、お釈迦さまが伝えたかったこと 古本竜太

今年の花まつりは4月2日(日)です。そして翌週の4月9日(日)は、西 別院で仏連(ロサンゼルス仏教連盟)の花まつりが営まれます。 「花まつり」とは、仏教の開祖である釈迦牟尼仏(お釈迦さま)の誕生 をお祝いする法要です。お釈迦さまは約2,500年前、現在のインドにお が特別で素晴らしいことを表してい

生まれになりました。大乗仏教では、 お釈迦さまの誕生日は旧暦の4月8日 ます。 だとされていて、日本では西暦の4月 8日に祝われます。

「釈迦牟尼(しゃかむに)」とは 釈迦族の聖者という意味で、「仏」 は宇宙の真理に目覚めた者という意 味です。お釈迦さまは、釈迦族の 王子としてお生まれになり、ゴータ マ・シッダールタと名付けられまし た。ゴータマとは「優れた牛」を意 味する姓で、シッダールタは 「目的 を達成する者」を意味します。父は シュッドーダナ王、母はマヤ夫人で す。釈迦族の国はカピラヴァストゥ といい、現在のインド北部とネパー ルの国境付近に位置していました。 マヤ夫人が出産のために故郷に帰ろ うとしていたところ、その帰路の途 中でお釈迦さまを出産されたと言わ れています。その場所が現在のネパ ールにあるルンビニです。

お釈迦さまが生まれた時に、ル ンビニには花がたくさん咲いていた ので、お釈迦さまの誕生日を「花ま つり」と呼び、お釈迦さまの誕生仏 を花で飾るようになったとされてい ます。その誕生仏の像は、お釈迦さ まが生まれたとき、七歩歩いて空と 「天上天下唯我独尊」と 地を指し、 言われたという伝説に由来していま す。この七歩は、六つの迷いの世界 や心の状態(天、人、阿修羅、畜 生、餓鬼、地獄)から解脱し、悟り を開いたことを象徴しています。そ して神々はお釈迦さまの誕生を祝 い、甘い雨を降らせたということか ら、お釈迦さまの誕生仏の像に甘茶 をかけるようになりました。 白い象の像を置くのは、マヤ夫人

が妊娠されたとき、白い象が体内に 入ってくる夢を見たとされているこ とからです。アジアでは、白象は吉 祥の象徴とされ、お釈迦さまの誕生

親鸞聖人は何千とある経典の中で 「大無量寿経(大経)」が最も重要 な経典であるといただいておられま した。「大経」では、お釈迦さまが 阿弥陀仏や阿弥陀仏の本願を説かれ ています。阿弥陀仏の本願には、阿 弥陀仏におまかせして(信心)、念 仏をとなえる者は、浄土に生まれる と誓われています。この方法は、涅 槃に至る最も簡単な方法であり、年 齢、性別、人種、社会的地位、など の違いに関係なく、誰でもできるの です。すべての人が平等に涅槃に至 る道を探し求めておられた親鸞聖人 は、信心のお念仏の道こそ、お釈迦 さまが人々に伝えたかった真実の教 えに違いないと考えられたのです。 お釈迦さまが伝えてくだ

On Sunday, April 2, Senshin Temple will observe the birthday of Siddhartha Gautama, an Indian prince who became the Buddha, the Awakened One, Shakyamuni (the Sage of the Shakyas).

This auspicious and special Buddhist holiday is observed in the Japanese Buddhist tradition on the 8th day of April. The birthday of Prince Siddhartha is called *Hanamatsuri*, or the "Festival of Flowers," recalling the flowers that bloomed everywhere and were said to have fallen from the sky when Siddhartha was born.

The speaker for the *Hanamatsuri* Service will be Rev. Mas Kodani. This year, we will combine it with the April Shotsuki service.
