

OHSOJI



This time, due to the Prajna staff's schedule conflict, we combined the November and December issues.



November and December are months for giving/sharing. We have Thanksgiving and Christmas gift giving. And because the tax year 2023 ends at the end of December, we do Dana to the temple and try to do *Kisha* joyful discarding/sharing.

We will have *Mochitsuki* on Saturday December 16 and *Oh sōji*, the temple cleanup, on the following day. The temple cleanup is one of our important activities to help deepen our understanding of Buddhism.

We call the temple cleanup *Oh sōji*, or *Ōsōji*.

The Romanized Japanese word “Ōsōji” is pronounced *Oh soh ji*. In this word, *Oh* means big or major, and pronounced like Ohtani Shohei’s “Oh.” *Soji* means cleanup.

Oh soh ji is a major cleanup to beautify all sections of the temple, not only the visible sections but also the hidden sections such as the dust accumulated on top of the shelf, windows, sash of the windows, the surface of the door, within the net of the screen door, beneath the sofa, etc.

In Buddhism, cleaning is one of our important practices. What is outside of ourselves and inside of ourselves are closely related. Our surroundings are a reflection of our hearts and minds and vice versa.

In some Buddhist sects, monks and lay followers carefully sweep the temple grounds and wipe down the corridors to cultivate their hearts and minds. They believe that dirt in the mind becomes dirt on the outside, and dirt on the outside becomes dirt in the mind. So they assume that picking up trash outside will also pick up trash in the mind. In this way, if they purify their minds, they can approach the enlightenment of the Buddha.

Jodo Shinshu has a slightly different way of thinking. We think that we do *soji* as an expression of gratitude to Amida Buddha, Shinran Shonin, and other people.

No matter how much we try to clean our hearts and minds, we will never be able to clean them completely. Cleaning up a dirty place completely is difficult since dust and dirt will soon gather from somewhere right after we finish cleaning. The more we clean, the more we find the dust in our

heart and mind. The dust is our *bonno*. *Bonno* is the desire from our ego, and those who are full of *bonno* are called foolish beings.

Shinran Shonin wrote in “Notes on Once-Calling, and Many-Calling,” “*Foolish beings: as expressed in the parable of the two rivers of water and fire, we are full of ignorance and blind passion. Our desires are countless, and anger, wrath, jealousy, and envy are overwhelming, arising without pause; to the very last moment of life they do not cease, or disappear or exhaust themselves.* (CWS p.488)”

And Shinran Shonin also taught, “Foolish beings: none other than ourselves.” Thus “You should take entrusting to the power of the Primal Vow to be essential,” and “Amida has vowed that the person of *shinjin*, having reached the stage of the truly settled, shall necessarily attain nirvana. (CWS p.488)”

Because we are full of *bonno*, and we are not able to remove them to attain Nirvana by our own effort, so Amida Buddha established the vow, enabling us to be born in the Pure Land and attain Nirvana. When we receive Amida’s vow, we become a person who can reflect on our self-centeredness that produces a lot of *bonno*. We also become a person who can thank Amida Buddha who established the Primal Vow for us, and can thank Shinran Shonin and the temple members who share the *nembutsu* teaching. Out of gratitude, we want to clean the temple where we can hear the teaching. Those who cannot appreciate the teaching yet will be able to appreciate the teaching by cleaning up the temple; so *soji* is an important deed in our

Jodo Shinshu.

Ohsoji for the temple is one of the Dana too, so let’s enjoy sharing the time and working with others.

大掃除

今回は11月号と12月号の合併号で、12月はプラジュナは届きませんから、12月もこの号をとっておいてください。それとまだ11月ですがお寺の12月のイベント、大掃除について書いてみたいと思います。

12月16日(土)は餅つきがあり、翌日の17日は大掃除をします。お寺の清掃は、仏教の理解を深めるために役立ちます。

自分の外側は自分の内側と密接に関係していて、私たちの身の回りの環境は私たちの心の状態を反映し、身の回りの環境が私たちの心に影響を与

えると考えます。それで、仏教の宗派によっては掃除を大切な修行として、僧侶や信徒がお寺の境内を念入りに掃いたり、廊下を磨いたりするところもあります。境内のゴミを拾うことは心のゴ

ミを拾うということでもあり、そのようにして心をきれいに清めていけば、仏の悟りに近づくことができるとされています。

浄土真宗では掃除は修行ではありませんが、自分の煩惱を見つめ、阿弥陀如来や親鸞聖人、そしてお寺の方々への感謝のご縁だとして掃除をするという考え方があります。

私たちの心はいくらきれいにしようとしても、完全にきれいにすることはできません。掃除をすればするほど、心のホコリが出てくるのです。心のホコリは煩惱です。煩惱とは自分に執着することから出て来る欲望で、煩惱だらけの人を凡夫といいます。

親鸞聖人は『一念多念文意』の中で『「凡夫」というのは、わたしどもの身には無明は煩惱が満ちみちており、欲望も多く、怒りや腹立ちやそねみやねたみの心ばかりが絶え間なく起り、まさに命が終ろうとするそのときまで、止まることもなく、消えることもなく、絶えることもないと、水火二河の譬えに示されている通りである。(現代語訳)』

と言われます。そして大切なことはその凡夫とは誰か?ということですが、同じ『一念多念文意』で、『「凡夫」とは、すなわちわたしどものことである。』と「他人のことではないよ」と注意喚

起され、そういう凡夫が本願のはたらきを信じることを根本とすれば、「必ず浄土に往生することができ、阿弥陀如来と同じく、この上ないさとりを開かせていただくのだ」と、お示しされています。

阿弥陀如来は、私たちが煩惱にまみれている存在であるからこそ本願を建てくださり、そのおかげで私たちが浄土に生まれ、涅槃に至ることができるのです。そういった阿弥陀さまの本願をいただくと、自己中心的な思いを持つことを反省することができるようになり、阿弥陀さまや親鸞聖人、そしてお念仏の教えをシェアして下さるお寺の方々に感謝することができるようにもなります。そして、感謝の気持ちから、念仏の教えを聞くことのできるお寺をきれいにしたい、と思うようになってくるのです。まだ教えをあまり理解してなくても、お寺の掃除をしていると、教えがだんだんわかってくるようになっていっているので、掃除は浄土真宗の大切な行いだとされているのです。

大掃除では、自分の煩惱を見つめ、仏様や皆への感謝の気持ちを持ってお寺をきれいにしていきたいと思います。

Senshin Bukkyo Gakuin Class Basic Teaching of Jodo Shinshu 2

We will summarize the teaching of the seven Pure Land Masters and the basic doctrine of Jodo Shinshu. Chanting *Ojo Raisan-ge* Class

Wednesdays, online, 6:30 to 7:15pm
December 20, 27

We will practice chanting *Ojo Raisan-ge* for the *Jyoya-ye* service. We also learn the content of the *Ojo Raisan-ge*. People who are not planning to come to *Jyoya-ye* can join the class. Please contact the temple for more information.

Bodhi Day Service Sunday December 3, 10a

In Mahayan tradition, we celebrate December 8th as **Bodhi day**. Bodhi day is the day to celebrate Shakyamuni Buddha's attainment to enlightenment. About 2,500 years ago under a pippara tree in a forest in India, a human Gautama Siddhartha awakened to the truth of the universe and became the Buddha. The tree was later called "Bodhi tree" and the town where the Gautama attained enlightenment is now called "Bodhgaya." *Bodhi* and *Bodh* mean awakening or enlightenment. To commemorate the special day for Buddhists this year, we will hold a Bodhi day service on Sunday, December 3. Guest Speaker is Rev. Mas Kodani.

Oseibo Service (the end of the year) Sunday December 10, 10a

We are going to hold the *Oseibo* service on Sunday, December 10 at 10am. The Japanese word *Oseibo* literally means "the end of the year". *O* is an honorific prefix, *sei* means year, and *bo* means the end; however, in Japanese, the word *Oseibo* indicates "year-end gift". In our tradition, we present *Oseibo* gifts to ministers and others who help to maintain the temple functions as an expression of our appreciation for their support, guidance, and kindness during the year. We will have an *Oseibo* year-end luncheon following the service.

Ohsoji, Temple Cleanup

Our temple cleanup will take place on
Sunday, December 17 at 8:00am.

Oh soh ji is a major cleanup to beautify all sections of the temple. *Oh* means big or major and *Soh ji* means clean up.

In Buddhism, cleaning is one of the important practices or daily deeds. Our surroundings are a reflection of our hearts and minds and vice versa. Cleaning outside means cleaning inside. When we clean up outside, we can also clean up in our hearts and minds. After *Mochitsuki*, to welcome the new year with a refreshed mind, let's clean our temple.

Joya-ye / End of Year Service Sunday December 31, 5p

We will hold a virtual *Jyoya-ye* service on New Year's Eve. *Jyoya-ye* is a year-end service that literally means the gathering (*ye*) of *Jyoya* (eliminating the night). "Eliminating the night" implies "the night, wishing to remove the dirt or filth collected during the year." In this case, the dirt or filth means our blind attachments, the memories of misconduct, and troubles that accumulated during the year. With the wish of dispelling these undesirable wants, thoughts, and memories, we hold the year-end service, welcoming the New Year with a refreshing mind. We will chant *Ojo Raisange*, *Shoya ge*. (*The Gatha of the Early Evening of the Gatha of Praising the Birth in the Pure Land*). You can learn chanting *Ojo Raisan* by attending the chanting class, following the Sunday service and Senshin Bukkyo Gakuin online class on December 20 and 27.

Shusho-ye (Gantan-ye)/ New Year Day Service January 1, 2024, Sunday 10a

Shusho-ye, or *Gantan-ye*, simply means "Service for the New Year." The literal translation of *Shusho-ye* is "a gathering for a revision, modification or correction." New Year Day is an opportunity for us to refresh our hearts and minds by reflecting upon the past year's mistakes so that we can correct them and begin the new year in the right direction. Our New Year Service will begin at 10:00a. This year, for the first time in three years, we will have *ozoni* and *sake* in the Social Hall. We are going to have a taiko and *Shishimai* performance at the courtyard.

除夜会

除夜会とは年末の法要で、「夜を除く集まり」と書きますが「夜を除く」とは、その年に身に付いた埃や垢を取り除くという意味です。埃や垢とは、私たちの煩惱、またこの一年間に起きた間違いや悩みごとなどを指します。そういった煩惱や嫌な思い出を取り除くことを願ってお勤めするのが除夜会ですが、浄土真宗では、そういった煩惱や嫌な思い出を引き受けてくださる阿弥陀さまに感謝し、「煩惱を断ぜずして涅槃をうる」とはどういうことなのかを考えるご縁でもあります。12月31日の午後5時からはいじまります。

修正会（しゅしょうえ）、元旦会（がたんえ）

一月一日にお勤めする法要を修正会といいます。新年の最初の日に心を正しい方向に修正するという意味があります。また、元旦にお勤めするので、元旦会ともいいます。浄土真宗では、阿弥陀如来に「お金がもうかりますように」、「病気になりませんように」とか「いい大学にはいれますように」などのことを祈りません。そういう願いはたいがい自分のエゴを拡張することになるので、本当の安心をえることが難しくなるためです。修正会は、そういう自己中心の願いがある自分を反省し、その自分を受け入れてくださる阿弥陀如来に感謝し、一年を心安らかに生きていくきっかけとなる法要です。

Vehicle Donation

This is a reminder that Senshin will take any vehicle (car, pickup, truck, motorcycle, and even boat) as a donation to the temple. Donors can report the full amount of funds received from the vehicle donation as a deduction on their tax returns.

We work with Harold's Car Donation Service (HCDS) to have vehicles picked up, processed and refurbished as necessary to bring in the highest sale amount for the donated vehicle.

Once the proceeds from the vehicle donation are received by Senshin, a letter is sent to the donor to acknowledge the vehicle donation. The letter includes details of the donated vehicle and the amount for which the vehicle was sold or salvaged. All donors will be acknowledged in the *Prajna*.

Donation College Savings 529 Plan

Senshin has a College Savings 529 Plan to help with the costs of higher education for our minister's family.

Contributing to this fund will provide tax-free income for the minister's children when they are college age. In eight years at 7%, monies put in today could almost double by the time they are ready to go to college.

If you would like to contribute, you have two options:

1. Write a check out to Senshin Buddhist Temple along with a memo or note indicating you would like to contribute to the 529 account.
2. You can write a check out to MESP (Michigan Education Savings Program) and mail it directly to PO Box 55925, Boston, MA 02205-5925. Be sure to send a note indicating the contribution is to go to the Senshin Buddhist Temple, Account #9393725.

If you write a check to Senshin, there is no minimum. If you write a check to MESP, the check must be \$25 or more.

Owned by the temple, the intention of the fund is to provide additional support to its minister and family.

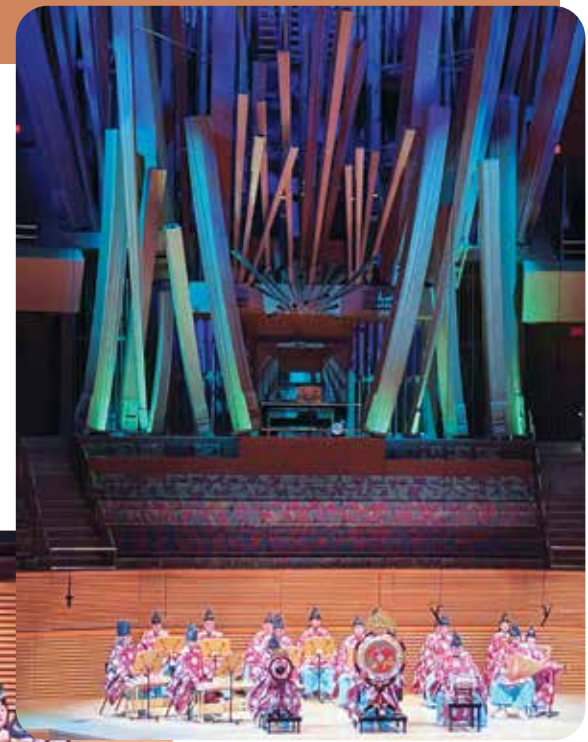
