or touch it. But we can sense spring, such as when we feel the warmth or when we see the brighter sunlight and the sakura flowers in bloom.


Spring is the name of the power or working that brings the warm weather after the cold winter. It also has the power to

> sprout and bloom the flowers and wake up the bees and butterflies to work. It also encourages us to go to the beach, have a party and enjoy a BBQ outdoors. We cannot see Spring, but we receive the working of Spring.

We cannot see Amida Buddha either, but we can sense Amida Buddha teaching, etc. Shinran Shonin stated, "Amida Buddha is light, and that light is the form taken by wisdom." (p.462)

In his life of *nembutsu*, he occasionally felt as if he was illuminated by the light or the teaching.

The light illuminates us and shows our ego that brings us troubles. The



when we recite the *nembutsu*, listen to the teaching, and when we reflect on our ego. Some Jodo Shinshu teachers say Amida Buddha is wisdom and compassion itself.

"In Notes on 'Essentials of Faith Alone" Shinran Shonin said that Amida Buddha has no color nor shape.

"Dharma-body as suchness has neither color nor form; thus, the mind cannot grasp it or words describe it." (p.461)

But if we cannot describe it, we cannot know Amida Buddha. So Amida Buddha took various forms such as light, wisdom, Namoamidabutsu, the

passion. By listening, hearing, and learning the teaching, we can sense Amida's light. It is also the power to guide us, cause us to have shinjin and to recite the nembutsu.

Like Spring, we cannot see Amida Buddha; but Amida Buddha is always working for us and we can sense Amida Buddha. Namoamidabutsu.

けれども、「春が来た」と歌い、 実際に春という季節はやってきます が、いったい春というのは何なので しょうか?春が来ると、暖かくな り、桜が咲き、蝶やハチが花から花 へ飛ぶのを見るようになります。

けれども、 春そのものを見たこと のある人はいません。春というのは あるのだけれども、色や形がないの です。春とは桜を咲かせ、虫たちの 活動を活発にさせるはたらきのこと をいいます。春を見た人はいません が、実際にそのはたらきを気候や桜 や蝶にみて感じる事ができます。

阿弥陀仏も私を救い目覚めさせる はたらきで、春と同様、色もなく形 もありません。「法身(ほっしん) は色もなく形もありません。ですか ら思いはかる事もできず、言葉で言 い表す事もできません。(唯信鈔文 意)」と親鸞聖人は言われます。

法身というのは、阿弥陀仏の姿の 一つで、お仏壇の中に安置する阿弥 陀さまの絵や木像の姿とは違う姿で はありますが、本質は同じです。水 が氷やお湯になるようなものだと思 ってください。

でも、色や形がなかったら目に 見えないのにどうして親鸞聖人は阿 弥陀仏がおられるとわかったのです か?と問いたくなります。

それは、春と同様、親鸞聖人も阿 弥陀仏のはたらきを受け、お慈悲の 暖かさを感じられたからです。 そ

のはたらきは私たちの心の闇を照ら して、私たちが愚かでたいしたこと のない人物だと知らせてくださいま す。そしてそのおかげでちょっとは ましな人物にならせていただこうと 思うようにもなってきます。

ちねんたねんもんい)」の中で「凡 夫(ぼんぶ)というのは、無明煩悩 が身に詰まっていて、欲が多く、怒 り、腹立ち、そねみ、ねたみなど悪 い心がひまなくはたらいています。 それが臨終の死ぬ瞬間までなくなら ないのです。」と、仏の光に照らさ れて見ることのできた自分の汚い心 について書かれています。

けれども、ただ心が汚いのをみて 終わるのでなく、「阿弥陀さまが そ ういう愚かな者をあわれに思われて 必ずお浄土に牛れさせてくださると の願いがありがたい、申し訳ない」 と感謝や反省がうながされ、「じゃ あ、ちょっとはましな人間になるよ うにしてみよう」と、できるだけ欲 張らないように、怒らないように気 をつけようとなってくるのです。

そういう気づきや感謝や反省がで てくるところに阿弥陀仏のはたらき を感じ取ることができます。

On Sunday, April 7, 2024, from 10am, Senshin Temple will be observing the birthday of Siddhartha Gautama, an Indian prince who became the Buddha, the Awakened One, Shakyamuni (the Sage of the Shakyas). This auspicious and special Buddhist holiday is observed in the Japanese Buddhist tradition on the 8th day of April. The birthday of Prince Siddhartha is called *Hanamatsuri*, or the "Festival of Flowers," recalling the flowers that bloomed everywhere and were said to have fallen from the sky when Siddhartha was born.

Speaker for the *Hanamatsuri* Service will be Rev. Mas Kodani (?). This year, we will combine it with the **April Shotsuki service**.

Anitya Committee

By the time we celebrate our 75th anniversary in 2026 we hope to have completed a thorough restoration of our buildings. The Anitya (Sanskrit for impermanence) committee has been formed and we have identified much work that needs to be done. The first project, already completed in December, was the restoration of the Mon (entry) and surrounding courtyard. Guided by the original plans drawn by Sam Mori in 1991, we repaired and replaced a lot of wood and everything was given a fresh coat of paint. It looks as good as new again!

Future phases of the restoration will be contracted as money becomes available.

They include refinishing the Hondo exterior, Social Hall exterior, breezeway canopy, and the teriyaki chicken BBQ area behind the rental house. Water-vulnerable woodwork on the Hondo will receive copper flashing and the surrounding garden beds will be regraded to keep water away. The windows on the south side of the Hondo will be replaced or re-finished so that they don't look foggy anymore. The Social Hall parking lot will be regraded to eliminate the deep rain puddles.

The estimated cost of the work the Anitya committee has identified is approximately \$300,000. Please consider donating to the 75th Anniversary Anitya Fund and help us restore Senshin back to its original beauty.
